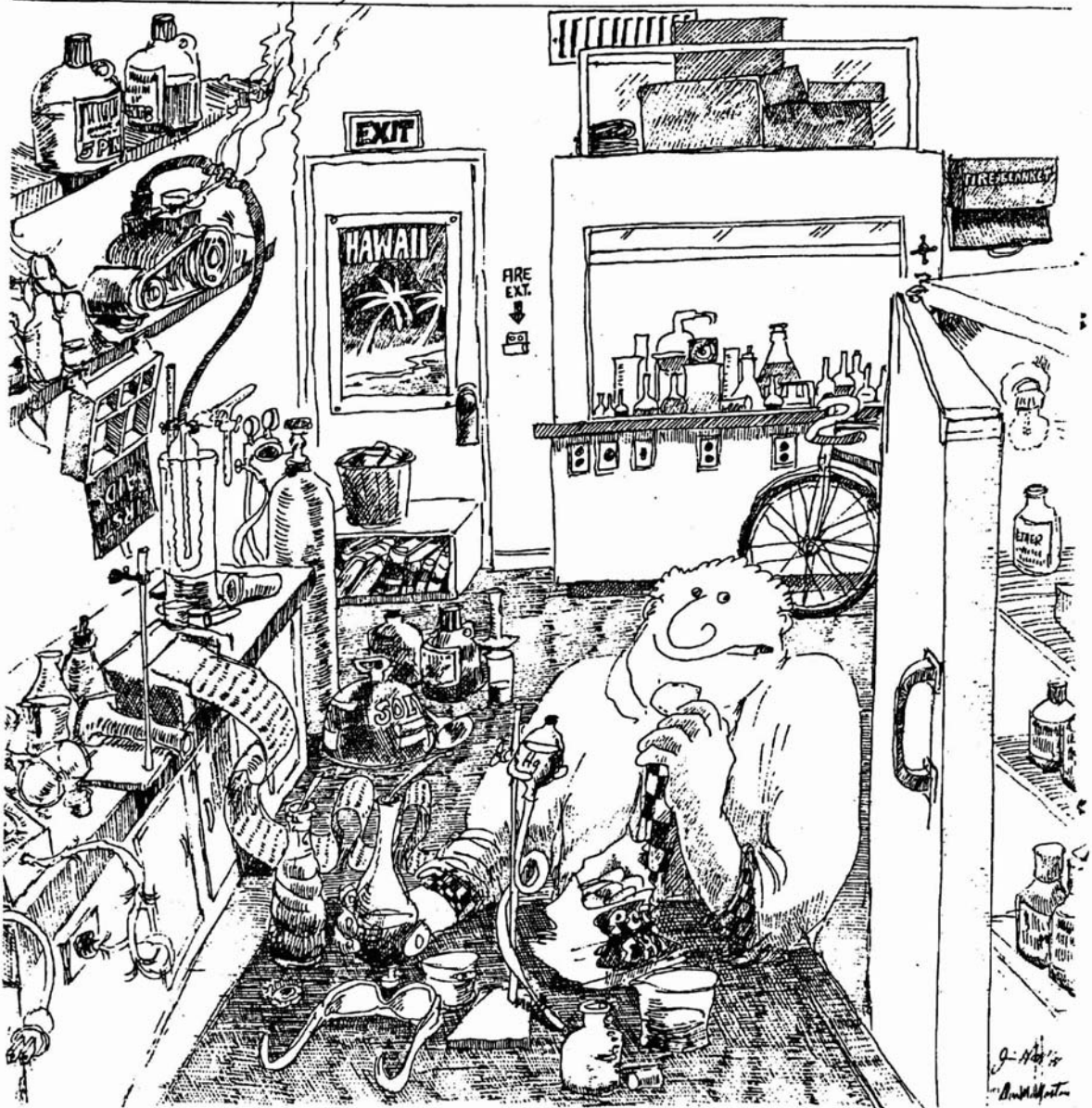
“I am very happy to be working at Princeton University. I hope I can contribute positively to the health and safety program and am looking forward to working with staff and faculty.”
