



The Near Eastern Studies Department and Princeton Environmental Institute welcome Toby Jones as a postdoctoral research associate on the Oil, Energy, and the Middle East (OEME) project. Dr. Jones joins us from Rutgers University, New Brunswick where he serves as an Assistant Professor of Middle East history in the Department of History. Before joining Rutgers' History Department, he was a visiting assistant professor and Mellon post-doctoral fellow at Swarthmore College. Jones earned his B.A. and M.A. in history from Auburn University and his Ph.D. in Middle East history from Stanford University.

Dr. Jones' main research interests focus on the history of state-building, politics, and Shia-Sunni relations in Saudi Arabia and the Gulf. Jones has taught courses on the history of the modern Middle East, the Arab-Israeli conflict, Iran and Iraq in the 20th century, the history of oil, and Islam and politics. He has also worked as the Persian Gulf Analyst for the International Crisis Group from 2004-2006 where he wrote about reform and sectarianism in Saudi Arabia and Bahrain. He has published in the *International Journal of Middle East Studies*, *Middle East Report*, *Foreign Affairs*, the *Arab Reform Bulletin* and elsewhere. His comments have appeared in *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *The Wall Street Journal*, and *The Christian Science Monitor*. While at Princeton, Jones will complete his book manuscript, *The Conquest of Arabia: Oil, Environment, and Empire* for Harvard University Press.
