## Research Interests

Wilcove searches for innovative ways to better protect endangered species and biodiversity in the United States and other countries, blending ecology and public policy. He is currently working with PEI postdoctoral fellow Will Turner on large-scale study of conservation planning and habitat management in the Lake Wales Ridge scrub ecosystem of central Florida, home to the highest concentration of endangered species in the continental United States. He has written extensively on imperiled wildlife and the Endangered Species Act, examining such factors as the causes of species endangerment, the geographical distribution of imperiled species, and the costs of habitat restoration and conservation.
